CODE OF CONDUCT

The school expects all students to maintain a high degree of discipline. Students are expected to communicate in English only during school hours. They should be dedicated to academics and participate in the co-curricular activities of the school. They should be well mannered, courteous and considerate to the needs of others.

Every student of the school is expected to be loyal to the school. He/she must follow all the rules and regulations meticulously as prescribed by the school. Any failure on the part of the student to abide by the rules of the school will attract appropriate punitive measures.

Members of the Student Council/Prefects/Monitors together with the staff are responsible for the discipline of the school.

Parents are requested to go through the rules and regulations and the code of conduct prescribed by the school and ensure that their wards follow them strictly as mentioned in the Student Diary.

EXAMINATIONS

1. Copying in an examination is a serious offence. No student is allowed to involve himself/herself either in copying or in helping others to copy.
2. Forging signature in any manner is an offence. Tampering with marks and grades either on the answer papers or on the progress report is strictly prohibited.
3. **A student found copying in an examination or using any unfair means will be awarded a zero.**

Admission Criteria for Class XI (Non-ISM Students)

All those Non-ISM students who secure at least 5% more than that of prescribed for ISM students shall be eligible to apply for admission to Class XI subject to the availability of seat in the particular stream.

MINIMUM CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO CLASS XI (ISM STUDENTS)

Only 40 students will be admitted in each of the classes. Kindly note that admission to Class XI is provisional and subject to Class X Board results and shall be based on merit i.e. percentage of marks. The given criteria are only the minimum percentage of marks for registration to a particular stream.

However priority will be given to those students who secure higher percentage of marks. In case of a tie in the % of marks in aggregate, Mathematics and Science, then the % of marks in English will be considered for deciding admission.

Kindly note that the above is qualifying marks. It does not ensure you the seats in respective stream.

Admission to Engineering Graphics, Computer Science, Informatics Practices and Mathematics groups will be strictly based on merit as the school has limited seats, i.e. 40 seats only.

There should be a minimum of 15 students to start a stream. If enough number of students does not opt for a particular stream, the stream will not be started.

The provisional admission to Class XI will be on the basis of the average marks of the best two out of three Preliminary Examinations held in Class X. So it is important that your ward performs well in the Preliminary Examinations.

Preference will be given to students of Indian School Muscat for the admission to all groups subject to fulfilling the above mentioned criteria.

We wish to recognize the contributions made by our students in the field of games and sports by awarding some weightage for their contribution. The details of the criteria taken into consideration are as follows:

There shall be seats reserved for ECA and Sports in form of seat 10% (rounded off) (6% for sports and 4% for others) of total seats and on 15 July, the vacant shall be converted into general category. The weightage could be as follows.

Note:

Kindly note that any student represented the National team will be given stream of his/her choice subject to Board results.

1. Relaxation shall be applicable with regard to all minimum percentage criteria fixed viz. subject & aggregate.

2. Only those students deputed by the school for the events/disciplines shall be considered. Individual performances in disciplines outside the ISM structure shall not be given weightage.

3. Only the performance in Class X at ISM will be considered. No weightage shall be given to a candidate who has not studied in ISM in Class X. However, candidates coming from India may be considered with regard to their performance at Zonal/National level subject to submission of verifiable valid documents. Only the highest level of performance will be considered.

PROMOTION POLICY FOR CLASSES IX & XI

PROMOTION:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">i. On obtaining a minimum of 33% marks in each subject in the Annual Aggregate.ii. Subjects having practical in Class XI will require a minimum of 33% marks in theory.iii. On obtaining less than 33% marks in the Annual Aggregate in one subject shall be given two retests in that subject and will be considered promoted provided the student obtains a minimum of 33% marks in the retest.iv. On obtaining less than 33% marks in the Annual Aggregate in two or more subjects the student will have to repeat the same class.v. Any student repeating and failing in the same class twice cannot continue in the school.vi. A minimum of 75% attendance is a must for promotion for all classes.
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
