Dear House Leaders.

Indian School Muscat strives to create more and better opportunities for the students to participate in as many activities as possible to expand their horizon to develop their skills in different areas so that by the time they leave their alma mater they are intellectually prepared for the challenging world. They will also be fully equipped to work hand in hand with the pupils of other nationalities, and our students will emerge as successful global citizens.

Keeping the above objective in mind, Indian School Muscat unfurled another initiative of organizing **Jhankaar Hues** – **an Inter-House Plethora of Talents** - for the students of Classes III to XII during the academic year 2022-23. This new initiative has provided a larger platform for our students to participate in large number in varieties of co-curricular events which will be held on 2 days in the month of May-June 2023. There are 30 events in total which will cater to the needs of the students of Primary, Middle and Senior Sections. These 33 events are going to be inter-house competitions.

The events will be organised for the students of Classes III to XII and they will be formed under three categories, namely:

- 1. Sub-Junior Classes III to V
- 2. Junior Classes VI to VIII
- 3. Senior Classes IX to XII

The Middle and Senior Sections have already got the House system in place. The students of classes III & IV are divided into four Houses. Each of the Houses across the school will be coordinated by the teachers of the respective sections. Each House will be led by a House Master, House Mistress, Assistant House Master and Assistant House Mistress and the other teachers will follow the guidance of these office bearers. Each House will have a Captain and a Vice Captain from Classes VIII to XI who will be elected democratically by the members of the House. Each class will be represented by a Vice Captain. For example, Green House will have a Captain from Class XII and the Captain will be assisted by four Vice Captains each representing Classes VIII to XI. These Captains and Vice Captains will be democratically elected by the members of the Green House.

A detailed circular shall be sent with the details of the competitions, a link of the rule book and a Google Form link for registration. Interested students can go through the rule book and then register themselves for the in-House selection. The data will be sorted out House-wise and category-wise and shall be sent to the respective House in-charge for conducting the in-House selections.

The details of all the inter-house events, their rules and regulations, judging criteria etc. are given in this handbook. The audition will be conducted in a fair and transparent manner with the permission from Principal & Vice Principal/Assistant Vice Principal of each section. Each House will be given the score sheet from which they are allowed to select the best students for the solo performances and group performances. These in-House auditions will be organized on Saturdays. The date and time will be decided by the School authorities in April/May 2023. The teachers from the Art/Dance/Music/Band departments and other teachers proficient in a field from other sections will utilized as judges for the audition.

Participation of students:

- One student can participate in a maximum of three events only whether group or solo events. House teachers and student leaders should ensure that maximum number of students participate in the in- House auditions
- The House office bearers will be given the results of the audition from which they will select the best student (markwise) for solo & group performances
- The House office bearers will have to hand over the list of final participants to the Vice Principal/Assistant Vice Principals on or before 20th May 2023 who in turn will hand over the list to the lead coordinator on 21st May 2023. No corrections will be entertained thereafter. The list should be shared **in excel format** only with the following heading:

The House Masters / House Mistresses shall identify the best two teams / performers in each of the events, except the Art Competition (there can be five participants from each House). In the Group events, the

House Masters / House Mistresses can include two substitutes who can be used in case of a last-minute drop out or absence of a selected participant. These substitutes should be selected from those students who appear for audition only. They may be from a group which may not be selected for the inter-house competition. The substitutes will also be given a Merit certificate in case of the team winning a prize. Otherwise, they too shall receive a Certificate of Participation. The final consolidated lists shall be sent to the Event Manager -jhankaarhues@ismoman.com- in the format that shall be sent to the House in-charge. The last date for submitting the final list is **Sunday**, 21st May 2023 at 2 p.m.

The files of the in-House auditions should be kept ready for verification of the Vice Principal of the section at all times.

A Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) and the judging criteria for the in-house auditions have been provided in this handbook for the smooth conduct of the in-House auditions. All the House in-charges are expected to go through them carefully and implement each of the procedures systematically for the successful conduct of the House meetings and in-House auditions.

If the House in-charges have any doubt in this regard, they can contact their respective Vice Principals / Assistant Vice Principal / Event Manager or the Coordinators of the inter-house activities in the section. The following are the Coordinators and their assistants:

Since all the co-curricular activities are made inter-house events, inter-class competitions which were organized by different departments stand cancelled.



SOP FOR IN-HOUSE AUDITIONS

- A House meeting shall be conducted with the House Master, House Mistress, all the House Teachers, Captain & the Vice Captains. Four venues shall be allotted for the four Houses by the Vice Principal.
- During this House meeting, information about various events shall be shared with the House. The House Office Bearers shall motivate the students to ensure maximum participation.
- All rules and regulations for the events can also be shared with the students.
- The in-house audition will be decided by the School authorities. The schedule will be informed to all. An announcement and circular towards the same shall be made over the PA system during the morning assembly.
- All such announcements shall be signed by the Vice Principal.

REGISTRATION

- The dates and time of the in-House auditions, names of teacher in-charges, venues etc. shall be displayed. Students shall register their names in the Google form that will be sent through a circular.
- The consolidated lists will be shared with the House in-charge.
- The teacher in-charge in turn can consolidate the lists of registered participants and prepare for the in-House auditions.
- Teachers from Art/Dance/Music/Band and teachers who are proficient in the events area from other sections will be assigned the duty of being the judges of the in-house audition.
- The in-house auditions should be transparent, fair and unbiased. Every interested student should be given an opportunity to participate in the in-house audition.

AUDITIONS

- All Performance will be judged SOLO ONLY
- Film/Movie songs are not allowed
- Venue for different events shall be fixed in advance.
- A schedule of the venues for the in-house audition will be given to the students in advance. The audition will be conducted on Saturdays as decided by the School authorities.
- Students shall perform all events in a school uniform.
- Audition for literary events shall be timed in such a way that no student is deprived of the opportunity to participate in more than one event.
- For all events solo and group audition shall be conducted as per the guidelines given in this rulebook.

- A section will be conducting the audition all the four houses together for an event at the same time. The same judges will be marking the performance of the students for an event.
- Once the audition is done, the scoresheet will be given to the house office bearers to make
 the list of final participants (after taking the highest mark scorers of the event). The House
 office bearers will chose Partipant 1, Participant 2 and substitute for the Solo event and
 Team 1 and Team 2 along with 2 substitute students for the group event
- Students should be categorically informed that **no re-audition will be conducted.**
- Parents are not allowed at the venue of the audition.

FINALISING THE PARTICIPANTS / TEAMS

- After the audition, the results should be declared without any delay. The results shall be countersigned by the House Master and the House Mistress. These results shall be displayed on the House display board with due approval from the respective Vice Principals.
- Once the audition is done, the scoresheet will be given to the house office bearers to make the list of final participants (after taking the highest mark scorers of the event). The House office bearers will chose Partipant 1, Participant 2 and substitute for the Solo event and Team 1 and Team 2 along with 2 substitute students for the group event
- Once the results are declared, the House Master/ House Mistress/ concerned House teachers should submit the registration forms well before the last date in the following format only to the Vice Principal who in turn will hand the same to the Event Manager on Sunday, 21st May 2023.
- No registration will be accepted after the last date.
- House teachers will have to assign teachers of the houses to train their teams/participants for the Inter-House Competitions at their convenient time (after the school hours, before school hours, during the recesses, weekends etc.) with prior approval from the Vice Principal and Senior Vice Principal administration.
- House Office Bearers shall refer to the Handbook for all purposes.

JUDGING CRITERIA FOR IN-HOUSE AUDITIONS

1. BHARATANATYAM – SOLO – (Senior, Junior and Sub-Junior)

- The theme, music should be of traditional Bharatanatyam style
- Students are allowed to wear School Uniform
- Duration of performance: Maximum 4 minutes
- Audio CD for the Performance: A DVD / USB that can be played on 'Windows Media Player'
 consisting of only the audio track for the performance should be handed over to the teacher in-charge
 well before the schedule.
- The DVD / USB should contain ONLY the audio track for the performance on it.
- Keep a backup DVD/ USB.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
 - Accessories & choreography 10; Music 10; Natya 10; Nritta 10; Abhinaya 10

2. <u>INDIAN CLASSICAL DANCE OTHER THAN BHARATANATYAM - SOLO (Senior and Junior)</u>

- Styles allowed: Kathak, Mohiniyattam, Odissi or Kuchipudi in traditional style only.
- The theme and music should be of traditional Kathak or Mohiniyattam or Odissi or Kuchipudi style.
- Students are allowed to wear school uniform
- Duration of performance shall be maximum 4 minutes
- Audio CD for the Performance: A DVD / USB that can be played on 'Windows Media Player' consisting of only the audio track for the performance should be handed over to the teacher in-charge well before the schedule.
- The DVD / USB should contain ONLY the audio track for the performance on it.
- Keep a backup DVD/ USB.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
 - Accessories & choreography 10; Music 10; Natya 10; Nrittya 10; Abhinaya 10

3. INDIAN CLASSICAL DANCE – GROUP (Senior and Junior)

- Style of dance should be any one from the following styles only: Bharatanatyam, Kuchipudi, Mohiniyattam, Kathak or Odissi.
- Semi- classical dances and movie-based songs are not allowed.
- The theme & music should be appropriate for the dance style and school competitions in Oman.
- Students are allowed to wear school uniform
- Duration of performance should be maximum 4 minutes.
- Each team can consist maximum of 8 students.

- Audio CD for the Performance: A DVD / USB that can be played on 'Windows Media Player' consisting of only the audio track for the performance should be handed over to the teacher in-charge well before the schedule.
- The DVD / USB should contain ONLY the audio track for the performance on it.
- Keep a backup DVD/ USB.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
 - Rhythm & Synchronisation 10; Elements of Dance 10; Accessories 10; Entry, Exit Formation & Choreography 10; Presentation & Audience Appeal 10

4. <u>CONTEMPORARY DANCE – GROUP (Senior & Junior)</u>

style of dance and song/music used should meet the following guidelines:

- Contemporary dance does not permit the classical technique in favour of modern dances.
- Contemporary dance is not necessarily narrative form of art.
- Choreography relies on technique.
- Unpredictable changes in rhythm, speed, and direction
- It permits multiple and simultaneous actions
- Creative freedom is given
- Independence between dance and music
- Dance to be danced, not analyzed
- Film songs are not permitted.
- The theme, and choreography should be appropriate for school competitions and respect the culture and traditions of Oman and India.
- Duration of performance maximum of 4 minutes.
- A group can consist of maximum 8 participants.
- Audio CD for the Performance: A DVD / USB that can be played on 'Windows Media Player' consisting of only the audio track for the performance should be handed over to the teacher in-charge well before the schedule.
- The DVD/USB should contain ONLY the audio track for the performance on it.
- Keep a backup DVD/USB.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
 - Rhythm & Synchronisation 10; Elements of Dance 10; Accessories 10; Entry, Exit Formation & Choreography 10; Presentation & Audience Appeal 10

5. Carnatic Vocal - SOLO (Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior)

- Either a Shruti box or Tampura will be allowed as accompaniment. (Note: Shruthi box or Tampura used can be either electronic or manual type)
- Contestants should bring their own instrument.
- Lyrics should be original.
- Pronunciation and overall rendering competence (Bhava) will also be judged. (GIVEN IN JUDGING CRITERIA)
- Duration of performance is maximum 4 minutes.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):

(The contestants should sing a Kriti or Keerthana. They should also brief the judges about the choice of their recital.)

■ Tala & Shruti – 10; Raga & Bhava – 10; Manodharma & Improvisation – 10; Diction – 10; Presentation & Overall Performance - 10

6. <u>Indian Light Vocal - SOLO (Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior)</u>

- Besides Shruti box or Tampura, number of accompanying instruments (optional) shall not exceed two.
 - o Note: Shruthi box or Tampura can be either electronic or manual type.
- Pre-programmed accompaniments (on electronic keyboard etc.) /materials/music/MIDI files/MP3 files/Karaoke will NOT be allowed.
- Only the song rendition will be judged. Background music will not be a judgement criterion.
- Contestants should bring their own instruments.
- Lyrics should be in One Indian language only.
 - o Note: Film songs are not allowed.
- Lyrics should be pertaining to the standard of school competitions.
- Duration of performance should be maximum 4 minutes.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
 - Choice of Song 10; Pitch and Dynamics 10; Voice Texture and Clarity 10;
 Melody/Rhythm 10; Overall Presentation 10

7. Indian Folk Song - GROUP (Senior & Junior)

- Apart from Tampura /Shruti Box (electronic or manual), up to 3 participants each playing a single background musical instrument (any type) is allowed. This includes the maximum 12 participants.
- Note: Pre-programmed accompaniments on electronic keyboard/materials/music/MIDI files/MP3 files/Karaoke will NOT be allowed.
- Only traditional folk song in any ONE Indian language is allowed.
 - o Note: Film songs are not allowed.
- Contestants can bring their own instruments.
- Duration of performance shall be minimum 5 minutes.
- Maximum of 12 students including the instrumentalists (up to 3 instrumentalists are allowed).
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
 - Choice of Song − 10; Co-ordination − 10; Creativity & Improvisation − 10;
 Harmony − 10; Overall Presentation 10

8. French Singing – GROUP (Senior & Junior)

- Maximum of 12 students including the instrumentalist (Only one instrumentalist is allowed).
- Pre-programmed accompaniment on electronic keyboard/ materials/ music/ MIDI files/ MP3 files/ Karaoke will not be allowed.
- Only the song rendition will be judged. Background music will not be a judgement criterion.
- Contestants shall bring their own instrument.
- No prop is permitted.
- Lyrics should be in **French only** and should be pertaining to the standard of school competitions.
- Duration of performance shall be maximum 5 minutes.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
 - Choice of Song − 10; Melody, Pronunciation and Harmony − 10; Voice Texture & Clarity − 10 Pace/ Rhythm − 10; Overall Presentation - 10

9. Western Vocal - SOLO (Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior)

- Only one accompaniment shall be allowed.
- Pre-programmed accompaniment on electronic keyboard/ materials/ music/ MIDI files/ MP3 files/ Karaoke will not be allowed.
- Only the song rendition will be judged. Background music will not be a judgement criterion.
- Contestants shall bring their own instruments.
- Lyrics should be in English only and should be pertaining to the standard of school competitions.
- Duration of performance shall be maximum 5 minutes.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):

Choice of Song -10; Pitch & Dynamics -10; Voice Texture & Clarity -10; Pace/ Rhythm -10; Overall Presentation -10

10. Rock Band – GROUP (Senior)

- Team Size: Maximum of seven students inclusive of singers and instrumentalists
- A standard drums set shall be provided to the teams at the venue by the organisers.
- All bands should bring their own instruments for their performance.
- A set up time of 5 minutes shall be allowed for each band.
- Songs performed shall be related to the Rock genre and shall be in English only with decent acceptable lyrics.
- Duration of performance shall be minimum 5 minutes.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):

Stage Presence -10; Coordination -10; Creativity & Improvisation -10; Harmony -10; Audience Engagement -10

11. Western Keyboard - SOLO (Senior, Junior & Sub Junior)

- Participants may use the built-in accompaniments and features of the keyboard.
- Pre-programmed material such as USB drives / Floppy drives/ music / MIDI files / MP3 files / Karaoke will not be allowed.
- Participant shall be allowed to refer to 'music score' during performance (if needed).
- Contestants are advised NOT to play piano pieces on the keyboard as these will not be considered for evaluation.
- The organisers shall provide a standard 5 octave keyboard, which the contestants may use. Alternatively, the contestants are allowed to use their own keyboards as well.
- Duration of the performance shall be maximum 5 minutes.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):

12. Western Choral Singing – GROUP (Senior)

- Maximum twelve students including the accompanists. Up to 3 participants are allowed to play a single non-pre-programmed background musical instrument.
- Lyrics shall be in English only and shall be pertaining to the standards of school competitions.
- Contestants shall keep in mind that it is the 'vocals' that are being judged, not the accompaniment/s.
- The use of the automatic accompaniments on the keyboard **is not allowed.**
- 'Heavy metal' type musical instruments including drums shall not be used.
- Pre-programmed material / music / MIDI files / MP3 etc. files shall not be used.
- Contestants shall bring their own instruments. (Note: The organisers will provide a standard 5 octave Keyboard, which the contestants may use.)
- Duration of performance shall be minimum 5 minutes.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
 - Co-ordination 10; Harmony 10; Pace (Timing) 10; Creativity & Improvisation 10
 Stage Presence 10

13. Collage – GROUP (Senior & Junior)

- Team Size: Two students in a team
- An A4 sheet MUST be used for the collage. The paper should be brought by the participants.
- Theme: My vision for my country @ 2030
- Art materials shall be brought by the participants.
- Participants are allowed to use the following materials to make their collage:
 - a. Any type of paper (newspaper, colour, crepe, waste etc), dry leaf, flower petals, grass etc., pencil scraping curls, gilt, cloth and waste material etc. (Use of scissors, blades, cutters etc. shall be allowed for cutting purposes)
 - b. Participants are NOT allowed to use colours (water, crayon, oil, spray, etc.)
 - c. Printed photographs/pictures etc., pre-drawn articles may be used as a unit but not as a whole picture.
 - d. Pencil may be used only for outline drawing. Border, if any, shall be made with the allowed materials only.
- Participants may use appropriate slogans, quotations, captions, etc.
- Participant's Chest number shall be attached to the collage.
- Participants may refer to pictures/photographs to aid the making of the collage during the competition.
- Participants may trace a 'prepared outline' of the collage design to the given drawing-sheet.
- Duration of the competition shall be 1 hour.

• Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):

■ Presentation of Theme – 10; Composition – 10; Colour Scheme – 10; Material Selection - 10 Overall Impact - 10

14. Graffiti Making - GROUP (Senior & Junior)

- Team Size: Maximum 4 students
- Theme: A nation of my dreams
- The participants may bring a pre-drawn outline along with them for the competition.
- A piece of white plywood measuring 5 x 5 ft shall be given for making the graffiti.
- Participants shall bring all the materials such as water-based colours and brushes, required for making the graffiti.
- Letters may be used as slogans/ titles.
- Participants shall not copy other's work.
- Stencils shall not be permitted.
- Spray paint shall not be permitted.
- Participants shall not include any symbol or image to disrespect any nation/religion.
- Duration of the competition shall be 1 hour.

Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):

■ Presentation of Theme – 10; Composition – 10; Colour Scheme – 10; Textural Impact – 10; Overall Impact - 10

15. Create a TV Advertisement - GROUP (Junior & Senior)

- Team Size: Maximum 4 students.
- Target: Community Service: Create an advertisement that promotes community service, encourages people to volunteer, or highlights the importance of giving back to the community
- **Originality:** The work shall be original. (Shall not be an 'Ad' already in use in the industry.)
- The advertisements that were sent for the earlier contests shall be disqualified.
- The team can use video camera, animation software, etc. for the creation of their advertisement.
- Care shall be taken not to project any unethical scenes. Footers such as 'Statutory Warning', 'Creative Animation' etc. if any needed shall be given as in any standard advertisement.
- **Standard:** The theme, dialogues, animations, costumes and make-up shall be appropriate for school competitions and respect the culture and traditions of Oman and India.
- The school shall NOT provide cameras, software, computer, other gadgets etc. to the participants.
- Each team shall submit the advertisement in a DVD which shall also contain details such as cast, crew, name of the House etc.
- **Date of Submission:** Entries shall be sent to House Master/House Mistress latest by 25th May 2022 before 10 a.m. in the form of a DVD in a suitable format that can be played on 'Windows Media Player'. **Late entries will not be entertained.**
- **Duration** of the advertisement shall be 30 45 seconds.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
- Concept 10; Editing 10; Creativity 10; Presentation (quality of video, animation, lighting) 10; Customer Persuasion 10

16. <u>Digital Photography & Album Making - GROUP (Senior & Junior)</u>

- Team Size: Maximum 4 students
- Theme: Landscape Photography: capture the beauty of natural landscapes, such as mountains, lakes, forests, or oceans.

19. MIME – GROUP (Senior)

- Team Size: Maximum eight students
- **Theme:** Open theme
- Only positive social themes can be presented. Care should be taken <u>not to present any</u> <u>religious/political/controversial themes.</u>
- The theme should be appropriate for school competitions and respect the culture and traditions of Oman and India.
- **Announcement of Theme:** It is compulsory that the team introduces the mime by stating its title and theme

20. Stand Up Comedy - SOLO (Senior)

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. **Number of Events**: There are a total number of 31 events.
- 2. Students are grouped under three categories
 - ➤ **Sub Junior Category**: Students of Classes III to V
 - ➤ Junior Category Students of Classes VI to VIII
 - ➤ Senior Category: Students of Classes IX to XII
- 3. No. of Teams/ Participants: Each House can send a maximum of two teams / participants that bagged the first and second positions in the in-House selection. Maximum two substitutes shall be included in each of the group events. Five participants from each House can be sent for the Art Competition at the Inter-House Competition.
- 4. **Team size:** As per the rules given for each event.
- 5. Last Date for Registration: As per the date given in the Circular / Announcement.
- 6. There should be at least four teams / participants from the Houses to organise an event.
- 7. Any change in the names of the participants, if any should be communicated to the respective Section Lead Coordinators on or before, Thursday, 25th May 2023.
- 8. **Identification of Participants**: Participants should carry their ID cards and show to their teacher coordinator who is responsible for the identification of participants.
- 9. **Reporting of the Teams**: Participants should be ready to perform and report to the venue 30 minutes prior to the event. There will not be any announcement or call in this regard.
- 10. **Disqualification**: A team will be disqualified if it fails to follow the rules specified for the event.
- 11. The results of all the events will be declared as soon as the event is complete, and the prizes for the first three prize winners will be given away during the valedictory function on Thursday, 1st June 2023 at 5:00 p.m.
- 12. **Valuables:** Participants should take care of their valuables. (Note: The event organisers will not take any responsibility in this regard.)
- 13. Entry for the audience will be restricted. Only ISM students will be allowed to enter the school premises by showing their ID cards. No parent will be allowed to enter the venues.

INAUGURATION & VALEDICTORY FUNCTIONS

INAUGURAL FUNCTION will be held on Wednesday, 31st May 2023 Sunday, at 7:30 am in the school's new multipurpose hall.

- **Flag March:** The Head Boy, Head Girl, the Student Council, the Captains and Vice Captains will march in with their flags.
- Reporting Time: 6:45 a.m.
- Participants and teachers should be seated at the allotted places in the new MPH by 7:15 a.m. for the inauguration.

VALEDICTORY FUNCTION will be held on Thursday, 1st June 2025 at 11:00 a.m. in the school's new multipurpose hall.

- 1. **Reporting Time:** Students and teachers should be seated by 4:30 p.m. for the Valedictory Function at the places allotted to them in the new multipurpose hall.
- **2. Prize Distribution:** The Captains, Vice Captains, House Office Bearers and the prize winners should move to the stage to receive the trophy when his/her House's name is announced.

IMPORTANT: First Prize Winners of some of the events will be asked to perform during the Valedictory Function.

GENERAL RULES ABOUT COMPETITIONS

- 1. **Respect the Culture and Traditions:** The themes, dialogues, costumes, choreography, make-up etc. of every event should be appropriate for school competitions and respect the culture and traditions of the Sultanate of Oman and India.
- 2. Dress Code & Identity: All participants, except those of the performing art competitions should be formally/smartly dressed. The identity of the participant and his / her House should not be disclosed before, during and after the event until the results are announced. Therefore, participants should not wear their school uniforms or introduce themselves to the judges. If any participant/ team reveals his/her/their identity by revealing his/her/their name, his/her/their House will be disqualified immediately.
- 3. **Events:** (Dos, Don'ts, Restrictions & Freedom)
- Accompaniments/accompanists/background music etc. live or recorded used in order to enhance the
 performance of a participant is allowed only if the same is mentioned as 'allowed' in the specific rules of
 the event. Otherwise, the participants/teams are not allowed to use such support.
- A student member in team -1 should not be fielded as a member in team -2 of the same event and vice versa
- A student can participate in up to three events without any clash in the timings of the events. The schedule of events is attached herewith. This rule is not applicable to events such as TV Advertisement Making, and Digital Photography & Album Making.
- Audio CD for the Performance: A DVD / USB containing only the audio track (if required) for the
 performance should be handed over to the Event Coordinator at the respective venues 30 minutes prior
 to the scheduled starting time of the event.

- The 'file format' of the audio should be supported on 'Windows Media Player'. Other types of audio file formats will not be accepted.
- The DVD / USB should be labelled with 'Chest No.' only of the team/participant. Do not write any number on the DVD other than the 'Chest No.' of the team/participant after the lots are taken.
- The DVD / USB should contain ONLY the 'audio track' for the performance written on it. (i.e. it should not contain other tracks of audio)
- Keep a backup DVD/audio file ready to meet any emergency.
- Please note that no prop should be used in Classical Dances. If any participant uses any prop, he/she will be penalized. However, those who perform Kuchipudi dance may use a plate or/and a pot.
- 4. **Performance Time Limit:** Participant/team exceeding stipulated maximum time limit for an event will be penalised as follows:
- Up to 30 seconds = 0 mark
- +30 seconds = 5 marks
- Above 1 minute = 10 Marks

Note: Deduction will be from the total marks obtained.

5. Chest Number:

- Chest Number is the 'identity code number' allotted to every team/participant by the organisers. The team/participant will be judged by his/her 'Chest Numbers' and hence the team/participant should wear the 'Chest No.' in such a way that is clearly visible to the judges during his/her performance. (Note: Original identity of the team/participant should/will NOT be revealed till the declaration of the results.)
- A team/participant that/who is found wearing a wrong 'Chest No.' other than the allotted one during their performance will be disqualified from the event. (Note: Do not interchange/exchange 'Chest No.' allotted to one team with other teams/participants)
- The teacher in-charge or the team leader/participant should be present at the venue 30 minutes before to take the lot for deciding the CHEST NUMBER. In case the teacher in-charge or the participant is not present, the Event Coordinator will decide the same as and when the team/participant reports.
- Order of Performance is only the chronological order of appearance of teams/participants on stage. (May not be in the 'Chest No.' order) There is no participation order for events such as Rangoli, Collage, Graffiti Making, Art Competition, Short Movie Making, Create a TV Advertisement, Digital Photography & Album Making, and Mega Minds.

6. Reporting for Performance

- Contestants should report to their respective venues 30 minutes before the scheduled starting time of the event
- The team/participants should be fully ready for the performance when they report to the venue. Extra time for make-up, prop work, music, practice, etc. will not be given.
- A team/participant that/who reports to the venue after 30 minutes of the scheduled starting time of the event *can be disqualified*.
- Once the 'Order of Performance' is finalised, there will be 'three calls' made for each team/participant to report to the stage for their performance. A team/participant that/who does not perform after the 'final' call (3rd call) will be disqualified from the competition. The organisers will be the final deciding authority on such matters.

PRIZES & CERTIFICATES – RULES

Top five teams / participants in each event will be given points as follows:

Event Type	1 st Position	2 nd Position	3 rd Position	4 th Position	5 th Position
SOLO Events	5	4	3	2	1
Group Events	10	8	6	4	2

Joint winners also will get the same points. E.g. If Teams X and Y are declared joint winners for the 1st prize in a group / Solo event, both the teams will be awarded with 10/5 points each.

- There will be only three winners, namely 1st, 2nd & 3rd in every event.
- The first 3 winners will be awarded with individual trophies and certificates.
- **Accompanists** will be awarded with a certificate of appreciation in case of the team or the participant winning a prize. If the participant or the team does not win a prize, the accompanists will receive a certificate of participation. The accompanists should be from the same House as the participant(s) irrespective of the category.
- All participants will be given certificates of participation.

RESULTS: AWARDS & ACCOLADES

The House that secures the maximum number of points at the end of all the events will be declared the winner of 'Jhankaar Hues' and will lift the 'Jhankaar Hues Rolling Trophy'.

In the event of a tie to the Overall Winner's position, the Houses involved will be declared 'JOINT WINNERS'.

Final Caveat:

- a. A team/participant violating the rule/s will be disqualified from the competition.
- b. The judge's decision will be final and binding in all respects with regard to the 'Final Results' of the events.
- c. The organiser's decision is final and binding in all respects related to Jhankaar Hues 2022.
- d. All grievances may be reported in writing at the Jhankaar Hues Office (the Event Manager) by the Team in-charge of the events.
- e. Any undesirable behaviour by the participant, or teacher in-charge will lead to disqualification of the participant/team(s).

 - Rules on reporting time, time limit violation, performance order, chest No., number of 'calls' for performance on stage, award of points, trophies, certificates etc.
- Participants should not reveal their names or House name till the end of the competition.

2. <u>INDIAN CLASSICAL DANCE OTHER THAN BHARATANATYAM - SOLO (Senior and Junior)</u>

- Styles allowed: Kathak, Mohiniyattam, Odissi or Kuchipudi in traditional style only.
- The theme, music, costumes and make-up should be of traditional Kathak or Mohiniyattam or Odissi or Kuchipudi style.
- Duration of performance shall be maximum of 10 minutes.
- Audio CD for the Performance: A DVD / USB that can be played on 'Windows Media Player' consisting of the only audio track for the performance should be handed over to the Event Coordinator 30 minutes prior to the scheduled starting time of the event.
- The DVD / USB should contain ONLY the audio track for the performance on it.
- Keep a backup DVD/ USB.
- Also refer to the General Rules to understand the following: Rules on reporting time, time limit violation, performance order, chest No., number of 'calls' for performance on stage, award of points, trophies, certificates etc.

3. INDIAN CLASSICAL DANCE - GROUP (Senior and Junior)

- Style of dance should be any one from the following styles only: Bharatanatyam, Kuchipudi, Mohiniyattam, Kathak or Odissi.
- Semi- classical dances and movie-based songs are not allowed.
- The theme, costumes and make-up should be appropriate for the dance style and school competitions in Oman.
- Duration of performance should be maximum 10 minutes.
- Each team can consist maximum of six students.
- Audio CD for the Performance: A DVD / USB that can be played on 'Windows Media Player' consisting of the audio track for the performance should be handed over to the Event Coordinator 30 minutes prior to the scheduled starting time of the event.
- The DVD / USB should contain ONLY the audio track for the performance on it.
- Keep a backup DVD/ USB.
- Also refer to the General Rules to understand the following: Rules on reporting time, time limit violation, performance order, chest no., number of 'calls' for performance on stage, award of points, trophies, certificates etc.

- Choreography relies on technique.
- Unpredictable changes in rhythm, speed, and direction
- It permits multiple and simultaneous actions
- Creative freedom is given
- Independence between dance and music
- Dance to be danced, not analyzed
- Film songs are not permitted.
- The theme, choreography, costumes and make-up should be appropriate for school competitions and respect the culture and traditions of Oman and India.
- Duration of performance shall be maximum of 7 minutes.
- A group can consist of maximum eight participants.
- Audio CD for the Performance: A DVD/USB that can be played on 'Windows Media Player' consisting of the audio track for the performance should be handed over to the Event Coordinator 30 minutes prior to the scheduled starting time of the event.
- The DVD/USB should contain ONLY the audio track for the performance on it.
- Keep a backup DVD/USB.
- Also refer to the General Rules to understand the following: Rules on reporting time, time limit violation, performance order, chest no., number of 'calls' for performance on stage, award of points, trophies, certificates etc.

Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):

5. <u>Carnatic Vocal - SOLO - (Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior)</u>

- Either a Shruti box or Tampura will be allowed as accompaniment. (Note: Shruthi box or Tampura used can be either electronic or manual type)
- Contestants should bring their own instrument.
- Lyrics should be original.
- Pronunciation and overall rendering competence (Bhava) will also be judged. (GIVEN IN JUDGING CRITERIA)
- Duration of performance is maximum 5 minutes.
- Also refer to the General Rules to understand the following: Rules on reporting time, time limit violation, performance order, chest no., number of 'calls' for performance on stage, award of points, trophies, certificates etc.

(The contestants should sing a Kriti or Keerthana. They should also brief the judges about the choice of their recital.)

6. <u>Indian Light Vocal – SOLO - (Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior)</u>

- Pre-programmed accompaniments (on electronic keyboard etc.) /materials/music/MIDI files/MP3 files/Karaoke will NOT be allowed.
- Only the song rendition will be judged. Background music will not be a judgement criterion.
- Contestants should bring their own instruments.
- Lyrics should be in One Indian language only.
 - o Note: Film songs are not allowed.
- Lyrics should be pertaining to the standard of school competitions.
- Duration of performance should be maximum 5 minutes.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
 - Choice of Song 10
 - Pitch and Dynamics 10
 - Voice Texture and Clarity 10
 - Melody/ Rhythm 10
 - Overall Presentation 10

7. <u>Indian Folk Song - GROUP (Senior & Junior)</u>

- Team size: Maximum of 12 students including the instrumentalists (up to 3 instrumentalists are allowed).
- Apart from Tampura /Shruti Box (electronic or manual), up to 3 participants each playing a single background musical instrument (any type) is allowed. This includes the maximum 12 participants.
- Note: Pre-programmed accompaniments on electronic keyboard/materials/music/MIDI files/MP3 files/Karaoke will NOT be allowed.
- Only traditional folk song in any **ONE** Indian language is allowed.
 - o Note: Film songs are not allowed.
- Contestants can bring their own instruments.
- Duration of performance shall be maximum 7 minutes.
- Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
 - Choice of Song 10
 - Co-ordination 10
 - Creativity & Improvisation 10
 - Harmony 10
 - Overall Presentation 10

8. French Singing - GROUP (Senior & Junior)

- Team size: Maximum of 12 students including the instrumentalist (Only one instrumentalist is allowed).
- Pre-programmed accompaniment on electronic keyboard/ materials/ music/ MIDI files/ MP3 files/ Karaoke will not be allowed.
- Only the song rendition will be judged. Background music will not be a judgement criterion.
- Contestants shall bring their own instrument.
- No prop is permitted.
- Lyrics should be in **French only** and should be pertaining to the standard of school competitions.
- Duration of performance shall be maximum 5 minutes.
- Also refer to the General Rules to understand the following: Rules on reporting time, time limit violation, performance order, chest no., number of 'calls' for performance on stage, award of points, trophies, certificates etc.

Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):

- Choice of Song 10
- Melody, Pronunciation and Harmony 10
- Voice Texture & Clarity 10
- Pace/ Rhythm 10
- Overall Presentation 10

9. Western Vocal - SOLO (Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior)

- Only one accompaniment shall be allowed.
- Pre-programmed accompaniment on electronic keyboard/ materials/ music/ MIDI files/ MP3 files/ Karaoke will not be allowed.
- Only the song rendition will be judged. Background music will not be a judgement criterion.
- Contestants shall bring their own instruments.
- Lyrics should be in English only and should be pertaining to the standard of school competitions.
- Duration of performance shall be maximum 5 minutes.
- Also refer to the General Rules to understand the following: Rules on reporting time, time limit violation, performance order, chest no., number of 'calls' for performance on stage, award of points, trophies, certificates etc.

Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):

- Choice of Song 10
