Please note that damaged books (e.g. broken in bindings, missing pages, soiled, musty or mouldy, writing in the text books) or clearly outdated materials and syllabus changed books will not be accepted.

Books meeting the above criteria strictly shall be accepted by the Librarian, Primary Section (A Block, 1st floor) between 11.00 a.m. and 12.00 noon on working days

1	CBSE CLASS X RESULTS: The exhilaration of accomplishment is apparent at ISM as students pace all along the road to triumph. The students of Indian School Muscat have once again brought laurels to their school by securing cent percent result in Class X CBSE Board Examination for the year 2017-18. A total of 549 students appeared for the examination and have displayed admirable performance. It is indeed an implausible achievement this year as 31 students have brilliantly secured A1 in all five subjects.
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29 ISM students scored fabulous 100 out of 100, 186 students scored above 90%, 386 students scored above 80% and 432 students scored above distinction. In all, ISM bagged 925 AIs across various subjects.
