- Oman generally has one of the hottest climates in the world, and receives very little rainfall.

- Some parts of the coast, particularly near the island of Masirah, sometimes receive no rain at all within the course of a year.
- Coconut palms grow in plenty in the coastal plains of Dhofar and frankincense is produced in the hills, with varieties of acacia.




