- The rainforests are so thick that the dense 'roof' created by leaves and branches does not allow the sunlight to reach the ground.
- The ground remains dark and damp therefore only shade tolerant vegetation may grow in these forests.

2. Explain how topography plays a dominant role in the distribution of population. Pg -60

- The mountainous areas with steep slopes have inhospitable terrain. Therefore, less number of people lives in mountainous areas.
- The plain areas provide the most suitable land for human habitation. The soil is fertile. Agriculture is the main occupation of the people. Therefore, the density of population is very high.

- The Ganga- Brahmaputra basin is dominated by monsoon climate, the monsoon brings rains from mid-June to mid-September.

- Terraces are built on steep slopes to create flat surfaces on which crop are grown.
- The slope is removed so that water does not run off rapidly.

- Development activities have led to gradual destruction of the biologically diverse rainforests.
- A large area of rainforests has disappeared in the Amazon basin.
- The top soil is washed away as the rain falls and the lush forest converts into a barren landscape.

- It's a way of cultivating land where farmers clear a piece of land by slashing or cutting down trees and bushes.
- These are then burnt which releases nutrient into the soil.
- Crops are grown in this cleared field for a few years.
- After repeatedly using the patch of land, the soil looses its nutrients so farmers clear another plot of land for cultivation.
