LETTER BUILDER



Materials Required: Building blocks, masking tape/any plain paper available at home and markers/ sketch pens.

- Parent will write using a marker pen on each building block uppercase letters and lowercase letters Uu to Zz. You can also use either a masking tape or any plain paper available for writing each letter and stick on the blocks.
- Next, mix the blocks and place it in front of the child.
- The child must find the correct pairs and build. Example, capital U and small u together, capital V and small v together and so on.
- Encourage the child to say each letter aloud as he/she picks it up.
- Optional – You can use this activity to revise all the letters from Aa to Zz.

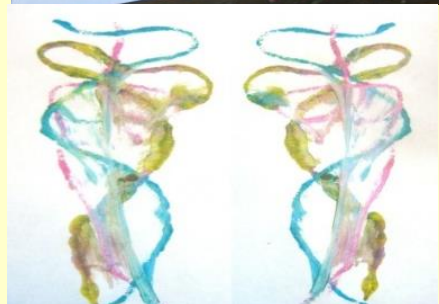
Learning Outcome: This activity helps the child to identify and understand the uppercase and lowercase letters.

Materials Required: Thread / string / wool or any similar object, water based paint of your choice and any blank paper which is easily available at home.

- Take a paper, fold it into half and then open it again.
- Dip the thread into the paint.
- Place the thread in any shape on one half of the paper.
- Fold the paper and press gently.
- Now, slowly pull the string out and open the paper.
- You will get a beautiful design on both sides of the paper.

Learning Outcome: This activity enhances creativity and fine motor skills in children.

SWING WITH STRING



AIM AND FEED



Materials Required: A small carton/box, chair, a pair of scissors, glue, newspaper and crayons / colour pencils.

- Draw a face of any character with a big wide mouth as shown in the picture.
- Ask your child to colour this picture.
- Cut it out neatly and make a wide cut for the mouth.
- Stick this cutout on one side of the carton/box.
- Cut out the mouth portion on the carton too.
- Keep the carton on a chair.
- Next, ask your child to make small balls out of newspaper.
- Instruct your child to stand at a distance of 3 or 4 feet from the carton and throw the balls into the character's mouth.

Learning Outcome: This activity helps to enhance gross motor skills and eye-hand coordination in children.

Materials Required: Barbecue stick / pencil, wool, safety pin, chart paper / cardboard, blue cloth / tub and paper clips / pegs as per your choice.

- Cut out fish shapes from the chart paper /cardboard and place the paper clips / pegs as shown on each fish.
- Write numbers and corresponding number names on each fish from 1 to 10 and place them on a blue coloured cloth or tub as per your choice.
- Make a fishing rod out of the barbecue stick / pencil by using a safety pin as the hook.
- Ask the child to fish the number called out by you. Example- when you call out the number 2, the child must use the fishing rod carefully and pick the fish with number 2 written on it.
- Keep repeating the activity until the child finishes fishing out all the numbers.

Learning Outcome: This activity helps in improving numerical skills and eye-hand coordination in children.
