The teaching methodology for Pre-Primary section is activity based. Hereby, we provide you with a list of activities that can be conducted at home under the guidance/supervision of parents. These activities can be carried out with the readily available materials at home. The ultimate aim of teaching is also achieved by carrying out these activities and it will be shared twice a week.

APPLE RALLY



Materials Required: Apple, grapes, and toothpicks.

- Cut the apple into the shape as shown in the picture.
- Next, cut the grapes into two halves to make the wheels.
- Insert a toothpick and fix the grapes as shown in the picture.
- Parents can assist the child in cutting and fixing of wheels.
- The apple car is now ready!

Learning Outcome: This activity helps the child to develop creativity and fine motor skills.

Materials Required: Paper cones or plastic bottles.

- Parents need to keep the cones/bottles in 2 rows with at least 2 meters between them. Mark the starting and ending points.
- Ask the child to stand at the starting position.
- Next, on the count of 3, the child must move in a criss-cross manner between the cones / bottles towards the end position.
- Repeat this activity 5 - 10 times depending upon the child's capacity.

Learning Outcome: This activity helps the child to improve agility and speed.

SHUTTLE RUN



PAPER DOLLS



Materials Required: Any coloured paper, glue stick, rubber band and 2 ice cream sticks.

- Take 2 papers and cut one paper half the size as the other.
- Now, fold them like a fan as shown in the picture.
- Attach both the folded papers with the help of a rubber band as shown in the picture.
- Cut out a circle shape and draw a face on it.
- Cut another strip of paper and make the hair as shown in the picture.
- Take 2 ice cream sticks to make the legs.
- Cut out shoes from the paper and stick them on the legs of the paper doll.

Learning Outcome: This activity helps the child to improve eye - hand coordination and creativity in a fun way.

Materials Required: Paper and pencil / colour pencil.

- Parents need to draw four arrow marks and cut it out.
- Write the directions (East, West, North and South) on a paper and then keep it around the child on 4 sides. Place the arrows also on these 4 sides.
- Parents should ensure that the child is facing the east and place the arrows and directions accordingly.
i.e. east in the front, west at the back , north on the left and south on the right side of the child.
- Explain to the child about the four directions and that the Sun rises in the east and sets in the west every day. Also explain that north and south will be left and right side of the child when he/she is facing east.
- To practice the directions, ask your child to face each side by calling out aloud the directions as he /she turns.

Learning Outcome: This activity helps the child to understand the four cardinal directions.
