A pill bug rolls into a tight little ball to protect itself. This bug is scared of you and not the other way around. These little grey or brown bugs are found everywhere in the United States except the desert. That is because they need to stay moist.One of their favourite hang-out is under damp flower pots.Do you know that pill bugs have something in common with the kangaroos? After her eggs hatch, the mother pill bug carries her young in a pouch under her belly. The little pill bugs stay there until they are big enough to be on their own. Just as snakes shed their skin when it gets too small, pill bugs do too.This is called “molting.” They are little like owls too. Pill bugs are nocturnal, meaning they are most active at night. That is when they most like to wander and look for food.And just like earthworms, pill bugs help break down plants in the soil. Pill bugs aren’t just nice bugs. They are interesting too.
