INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS:

- Login from your school mail ID and access the **Google Classroom group 1** (eg 10A_1).
- Download the question paper save it in your computer.

 Answer the questions neatly in a ruled answer sheet. Provide your full name, roll number, class and section on the first page of your answer sheet.
- Write the correct question numbers in the margin and write the answers only as you write in an examination.
- Scan the answer sheets and save them as one PDF file (your name subject class section and roll number can be the file name, eg Arun_english_24.pdf).
- Click on the **Answer Upload** link. Fill the Google form, upload the answer file (pdf file) and submit within the time specified. You can submit the form only once.
- The Examination will start at 10 a.m. and not at 7 a.m. as per the date sheet given to you. You can use the first 15 minutes for reading the question paper and the writing time is from 10.15 a.m. to 1.15 p.m. You can take 20 minutes for scanning and uploading the answer sheets. The entire process should be completed by 1.35 p.m. You will not be able to upload the answer sheet after 1.35 p.m.
- Answer sheets sent by email will not be evaluated.
