

Invitations will be extended to speakers, seeking their unique insights and perspectives to inspire and guide the ISM community on the following topics:

- 2. Future Goals & Roadmaps of ISM: Discuss the strategic vision and objectives that ISM aims to achieve in the coming years. Share insights into the school's long-term plans for continuous improvement.
- 3. Holistic Profile of a Learner in ISM: Explore the multi-faceted development that students undergo at ISM, encompassing academic excellence, character building, and extracurricular achievements.
- 4. **Global Citizenship at ISM**: Examine how ISM cultivates a sense of global citizenship among its students, fostering awareness, understanding, and a commitment to making a positive contribution on a global scale.
- 5. **Technology Integration in Education**: Discuss the approach to integrating technology into the learning environment, exploring the role of digital tools in enhancing education and preparing students for the challenges of digital age.
- 6. **Cultural Diversity and inclusivity**: Showcase how ISM celebrates and promotes cultural diversity, creating an inclusive environment that prepares students to thrive a multicultural world.

CURTAIN TALES (INTER-HOUSE DRAMA COMPETITION (For the Students of Indian School Muscat Senior Section only)

Inter House drama competition is meant to encourage creativity, team work and performance skills among the students. This competition provides the opportunity for the students to show their talents and creativity in the art of dramatization, script writing, directing and stage setting and other technical support.

Day & Date of the Competition: During Jhankaar Hues 2024 Time: 8:00 am to 10:00 am Duration of the Drama: 20 minutes maximum Language of the Drama: English only Music: live or recorded

- 1. This competition is open to all students from class 9-12 and the respective house in-charges must conduct an audition to select the members to represent the house in the drama competition.
- 2. Each house team shall comprise a maximum of 12 members which includes technical support team such as stage setter, props makers, back ground musician and script director. (Two teacher representatives are mandatory as a coordinator or director of the team)
- 3. All team members must be from the **same** house only.
- 4. It is compulsory to use **English language** throughout the drama and use of pun language or objectionable gestures and scenes are strictly prohibited (including the costume). Any violation to this shall lead to the disqualification of the team.
- 5. The house is responsible for selecting the play or script for their performance. Play must be suitable for school settings and appropriate to the guidelines of the school and the law of this land.
- 6. The script will have to be shared with the event coordinator for the approval one month before the competition. Drama scripts must include synopsis and cast lists and be typed using Font 12 Times New Roman.
- 7. The house is allowed to use the script that is approved by the event coordinator only. Any deviation from the approved scripts shall lead to the disqualification of the team.
- 8. The teams will be allowed a maximum of 5 minutes to set the stage and 20 minutes to perform. If any team exceeds the time, points will be deducted:
 - Up to 1 minute = 0 marks
 - Above 1 minute = 5 marks
 - 5 marks from every next minute
 - Note: Deduction will be from the total marks obtained
- 9. A lot will be taken the previous day to decide the order of the performance.
- 10. The use of props is allowed but it should be minimum and cost effective. The safety of the props and sets are the responsibility of the respective house. Drawing curtain

is not allowed in between the scenes. Each team should have a technical person to manage the music and lights with the help of school support team. (Live or recorded music is allowed)

- 11. Props making and rehearsal is the sole responsibility of house and house in charges. The school will not allow any practice or prop preparation during the academic hours.
- **12.** Judges' decision will be final and binding. In case of any dispute, the decision will rest with the event team.
- 13. The points of the competition will be added to the Jhankaar Hues 2024
- 14. Prizes are awarded as: Best Drama, 2nd Best Drama, Best Actor, Best Actress, 2nd Best Actor, 2nd Best Actress.
- 15. Judging Criteria
 - Script
 - Acting
 - Costume, Use of props, Lights & Music
 - Direction
 - Overall impact

RELIVING MOMENTS – (For the Parents and Students of Indian School Muscat)

This event is divided into 2 categories

- 1. Competitive events
- 2. Non-Competitive events

CATEGORY 1: COMPETITIVE ITEMS

Poetry Recitation Competition:

- a) The poetry should be only in English
- b) The competition is only for 3 minutes. If the poetry exceeds more than 30 secs, 10 marks will be reduced from the total.
- c) The order of speaking will be decided by drawing lots at the venue, thirty minutes before the commencement of the event.

- d) Contestants will recite a dramatic poem of their choice.
- e) While occasional consultation of the poem may be permitted, reciting from a script will result in loss of points.
- f) The participants must register their names earlier in the google form that will be given. Only registered candidates will be allowed to participate. 25% of the best performers will be given a gift voucher.
- g) Judgement Criteria: (50 MARKS):
 - Appropriate Choice of Poem
 - Voice and Articulation
 - Coordination
 - Dramatic Appropriateness
 - Overall Performance

Comedy Skit

- a) The language is English only. Orating the
- b) The competition is only for 3 minutes. If the skit exceeds more than 30 secs, 10 marks will be reduced from the total.
- c) The teams are free to select the theme/story/script of the skit but use original and creative concepts so that it will be free from copyright issues. The script will have to be shared with the event coordinator one week before the competition. (Script should be in English and for particular expression appropriate regional language can be used)
- d) Keeping in mind the audience, culture and law of the country, avoid using inappropriate content such as offensive language, explicit materials, and intensive jokes. This can lead to the disqualification of the team from the competition.
- e) Props are allowed and it will be arranged by the teams themselves (General furniture like table/chairs will be made available at the event venue).
- f) The participants must register their names earlier in the google form that will be given. Only registered candidates will be allowed to participate. 25% of the best performers will be given a gift voucher.
- g) Judging Criteria (50 marks)
 - Script,
 - Comedy in the skit,
 - Expressions and acting,
 - Stage mannerism,
 - **Overall** performance •

Singing Competition

- a) The song can be in English or any Indian Language
- b) The competition is only for 3 minutes. If the singing exceeds more than 30 secs, 10 marks will be reduced from the total.
- c) The selection of song should be appropriate to school standards. Participants must keep in mind the culture and law of the country. Any controversial content can lead to disgualification of the team. The lyrics of the song should be shared with the coordinator of the event one week prior to the competition.

- d) Pre-programmed accompaniment on electronic keyboard/ materials/ music/ MIDI files/ MP3 files/ Karaoke will NOT be allowed.
- e) Film songs are not allowed.
- f) Only one accompaniment is allowed.
- g) The participants must register their names earlier in the google form that will be given. Only registered candidates will be allowed to participate. 25% of the best performers will be given a gift voucher.
- h) Judging Criteria (50 marks)
 - Coordination
 - Pitch & Dynamics
 - Voice Texture & Clarity
 - Pace/ Rhythm
 - Presentation

Folk Dance

- a) The competition is only for 3 minutes. If the dance exceeds more than 30 secs, 10 marks will be reduced from the total.
- b) The theme, costumes and make-up must be appropriate for school competitions and must respect the culture and traditions of Oman.
- c) Song and dance should be of <u>Indian traditional Folk</u> only. Team's performing styles that come under ritual, tribal, classical and cinematic folk will be disqualified.
- d) **Audio CD for the Performance:** A USB that can be played on 'Windows Media Player' consisting of the audio track for the performance should be handed over to the Event Coordinator 30 minutes prior to the scheduled starting time of the event.
- e) The DVD/USB should contain ONLY the audio track for the performance on it.
- f) Keep a backup USB.
- g) The participants must register their names earlier in the google form that will be given. Only registered candidates will be allowed to participate. 25% of the best performers will be given a gift voucher.
- h) Judging Criteria (Out of 50 Marks):
- Rhythm & Synchronisation
- Elements of Dance
- Costumes & Accessories
- Entry, Exit Formation & Choreography
- Presentation & Audience Appeal

Painting Competition

- a) Theme of the contest: Open theme (No controversial theme must be selected. It should adhere to the law of the country)
- b) Duration of the competition: 90 minutes.
- c) Size of the paper: A3 size. Drawing sheet will be provided by the school.

- d) Medium of the artwork: Colour pencil/watercolour/acrylic colour.
- e) Participants should bring all art materials.
- f) Artwork should be original. Should not copy any others' artwork / internet etc.
- g) The participants must register their names earlier in the google form that will be given. Only registered candidates will be allowed to participate. 25% of the best performers will be given a gift voucher.
- h) Judging criteria:
 - Subjects
 - Life study
 - Colour harmony
 - Composition and Aesthetics

CATEGORY 2: NON-COMPETITIVE ITEMS

The Team should consist of 2 members (parent + child). The team should register their names in the google form that will be shared. Only registered team will be allowed to participate. The performance should be appropriate to the school standard. The participant should adhere to the law of the country).

The items for the non-competitive items are as follows:

- a. **Fashion Show (thematic)** The team should present a theme before the audience. The team is not allowed to speak. They are allowed to use the props as costume. 30 secs are allowed for a team
- b. Fancy Dress The team will be given 30 secs for their performance.
- c. **Beat Boxing** The team can do the beat boxing for a duration of 3 minutes.
- d. Mimicry Language used is English or any Indian Language
- e. Juggling
- f. Any other Talent That can be performed in 3 minutes

(Inter School Rock Fest) Day & Date : Thursday, October 17, 2024 Maximum time: 10 minutes

- a) Duration of performance should be **maximum 10 minutes** (if the time exceeds by 30 secs, 10 marks will be deducted from the total marks)
- b) A school can send 2 teams only.
- c) Number of participants: 8 to 10 in each group (inclusive of singers and instrumentalists)
- d) A standard drums set will be provided to the teams at the venue by the organizers.
- e) All bands should bring their own instruments for their performance.
- f) A set up time of 5 minutes will be allowed for each band. (If the time exceeds by 1 minute, 5 marks will be deducted from the total marks)
- g) Songs performed should be related to the Rock genre and should be in English only with decent acceptable lyrics.
- h) No preset music should be played. Use of laptop should be avoided.
