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- 5. The artist creates an interesting form of a woman by hollowing out the face. The absence of face gives it a sad expression. The graphic print depicts the figure of a lonely woman seated on the pavement before a ruined wall. In the foreground, we only get a glimpse of the lower part of a poor man lying on the ground, contrasting with the clothed woman, and adds to the sadness of the print.
 - (i) Identify and name the artist.
 - (ii) Name the painting and subject matter, human life values?
 - (iii) Explain logically with your artistic point of view.

The painting shows a faceless figure with soft flowing drapes of the blue bordered white saree that is adorned by a female figure, she is carrying a sick person protectively on her lap. The figure of this female acquires a certain monumentality and the stature of the universal mother, while the figure of the man is vulnerable and lies in her lap.
