7.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Enabling Act established dictatorship in Germany. It gave Hitler all powers to sideline the Parliament and rule by decree. All political parties and trade unions were banned except for the Nazi Party and its affiliates. The state established complete control over the economy, media, army and judiciary.(Any Two Points) 	2
8.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All schools were cleansed and purified. This meant that teachers who were Jews or seen as ‘politically unreliable’ were dismissed. Children were first segregated: Germans and Jews could not sit together or play together. Subsequently, ‘undesirable children’ – Jews, the physically handicapped, Gypsies – were thrown out of schools. And finally in the 1940s, they were taken to the gas chambers. ‘Good German’ children were subjected to a process of Nazi schooling, a prolonged period of ideological training. Racial science was introduced to justify the Nazi ideas of race. The Maths classes were used to popularize the Jews and worship Hitler. Even the function of sports was to nurture a spirit of violence and aggression among children. Hitler believed that boxing could make children iron hearted, strong and masculine.(Any Three Points) 	3

This means that everyone should have one vote and every vote should have equal value. • There should be something to choose from. Parties and candidates should be free to contest elections and should offer some real choice to the voters. • The choice should be offered at regular intervals. Elections must be held regularly after every few years. • The candidate preferred by the people should get elected. • Elections should be conducted in a free and fair manner where people can choose them at their will.(Any Three Points) 	3
