The teaching methodology for Pre-Primary section is activity based. Hereby, we provide you with a list of activities that can be conducted at home under the guidance/supervision of parents. These activities can be carried out with the readily available materials at home. The ultimate aim of teaching is also achieved and it will be shared twice a week.

PAPER MAGIC



Materials required: Any papers of their choice like pamphlets of LuLu, old magazines, old newspapers, etc., a glue stick and a bowl.

- Tear the paper into small bits and put it in a bowl.
- Now crush the bits properly.
- Parents can help to draw an outline of your child's palm and stick the bits of crushed paper inside the outline of the palm by neatly filling it.

This simple experiment will enhance the child's observational and visual motor skills.

Materials required: cotton ball/soil, yogurt cups or plastic pots, green moong seeds / bean seeds.

- Take the cotton ball / soil, moisten it with a little water.
- Choose a container like yogurt cups or plastic pots, put the cotton / soil inside it.
- Place green moong seeds / bean seeds on the damp cotton / soil.
- Keep the container in sunlight.
- Parents should help their children to water it regularly and wisely.
- The seeds should sprout, growing a root to access water.
- The seed grows shoots that grow towards the sun.
- The shoots grow leaves.
- This is the seed germination process.

This activity shows that plants are living things and need adequate sunlight, air and water to grow. It also inculcates a habit in children to protect and conserve nature.

WATCH ME GROW



FLEXY JUMP



Materials required: Any available paper, paints

- Take any paper cut it into circles, four in number and stick it on the wall as shown.
- The papers can be painted in different colours of your choice.
- You can also write alphabets or numbers or draw shapes on the paper.
- Ask your child to stand below the circles pasted on the wall.
- Call out the colour/alphabet/number or shape.
- And now let the child jump and touch the called out circle.
- You can raise the height of the circles pasted so that the child can jump or stretch higher.

This activity improves gross motor skills along with learning Alphabets, Numbers, Colours and Shapes.

Materials required: A Cardboard /Blank paper, Paints, Colour Pencils, Cotton swabs (Q-tip).

- Take a cardboard/blank paper or any paper available at home.
- Write lowercase letters on the paper using different colored pencils.
- Add a bit of each paint matching colors of the letters onto a paper plate and place a Q-tip into each one.
- Encourage the child to trace the letters with the Q-tip and match the paint color to the letter color.

This activity enhances the recognition of colors, eye-hand coordination, fine motor skills, writing skills.

MY IMPRINTS



Materials required: White paper / any available paper, water based paint of your choice and paint brush.

- Use the paint brush to apply the paint on the palm and fingers of the child.
- Turn the painted palm facing the paper and gently press it on the paper.
- Then remove the hand. Now you can see the imprint of the palm.
- Repeat the above mentioned steps to create a pattern of flower or any design of your choice and let it dry.

This activity enhances knowledge of colours and eye-hand coordination.
